

In *Crooked*, Grossman reimagines Nixon as an unlikeable, but ultimately compelling, antihero trying to save the U.S. (and the world) from a secret war of unknowable horrors. May continues to tell tales of the sword-wielding, sneaker-wearing princess, illustrated by Libby – until Libby's tragic accidental death. When the lonely teenaged May sees fan art and a webcomic appear with



their character, she is surprised ... and as she explores the mystery behind the reemergence of her creation, she begins wondering if Libby is dead after all.
